

WILLIAMSON PARK

Williamson Park consists of 54 acres of park and woodland, as well as the butterfly house, gift shop and other attractions. It is home to the Ashton Memorial (Sometimes described as 'The Taj Mahal of the North'!), a beautiful Edwardian building which can be seen on the skyline for miles around.



EXPLORE





As one of the few collegiate universities in the UK we welcome each student to one of our nine colleges on campus. In addition to our eight undergraduate colleges, we have one dedicated to our postgraduate students. The Lancaster campus is situated near the Lake District with beautiful green surroundings.

FACILITIES

- Modern Sports Centre with facilities including a climbing wall, gym and swimming pool
- Other facilities include: new redesigned Library, Learning Zone, Travel Agents, Banks, Hairdresser, Restaurants, Shops, Students' Union, Doctor's Surgery, Dentist, Pharmacy, Post Office, Chaplaincy Centre and Prayer Rooms

ACCOMMODATION

- All students will have their own en-suite room, with male and female students being separated
- There is internet access in your room, wi-fi can also be accessed across campus
- Launderette, washing and drying facilities are situated across campus within each college
- Sim cards can be bought in the town centre
- Lancaster train station is easily accessible and has good travel links across the country
- Local bus links mean transport is always available between the Lancaster University campus and city centre

FOOD ON CAMPUS

- Halal food is provided by university catering and also by the Sultan food outlet on campus
- Lancaster campus has plenty of restaurants and takeaway vendors; from the Sultan to Wong's Kitchen to Wibbly Wobbly Burger Bar.

COLLEGES

Lancaster is one of the few Universities in the United Kingdom to have a collegiate system. Every student studying at Lancaster is a member of college and through their college take part in countless social activities and sporting events.

CELEBRATION EVENT


This is the opportunity for you to share your experiences and celebrate your achievements. This event will be a fun way to end the programme before we have to say farewell!

LEISURE

WEEKENDS

Your weekends are your own free time, but we know from previous trips that you are interested in visiting certain places within the UK.

SCOTLAND, EDINBURGH*

Explore Edinburgh Castle and dungeons, enjoy some of the world's best artwork in the Scottish National Gallery and visit The Elephant House where J.K Rowling famously wrote Harry Potter over a delicious coffee.

DAY TRIP TO THE CITY OF YORK*

Explore the city's ancient history, quaint cobbled streets and iconic landmarks while fitting in some time for shopping and a traditional English Afternoon Tea.

THE LAKE DISTRICT, WINDERMERE*

Visit one of the largest natural lakes in England and enjoy the picturesque surroundings of the mountain peaks and nearby villages.

WALES, CONWY AND SNOWDONIA*

Take a look around the town that inspired Alice in Wonderland, walk down the north coast's stunning sandy beaches, visit Conwy's historic harbour and conquer Wales' highest mountain Snowdon by steam train.

GREATER MANCHESTER. MANCHESTER*

An hour away from Lancaster the city of Manchester has a huge number of shops to keep you busy all day, but for all you football fans the Manchester United Football Ground is located near to the city centre should you want to have a tour.

EVENINGS

In the UK businesses and shops predominately shut at 5pm, which we know is quite early.

With this in mind we can offer a range of evening activities that you can participate in including:

- The Great British Bake Off, learn to bake delicious British cakes from Scones to Welsh cakes
- Creative Writing workshop with North West Poets. Learn poetry and short story writing skills which can be used during your stay to document the week in a fun way
- A range of sporting activities such as football, cricket, netball or even rounders (which is a bit like baseball!)
- Quiz, compete with friends and be tested on what you have learnt about British Culture for a top prize
- Trip to the Trafford Centre, our second largest shopping centre in the country! Shops are open until 10pm and there's even an arcade and the opportunity to go bowling!
- Watch an outdoor play at Williamson Park, one of Lancaster's most beautiful spots (subject to availability)*
- Brit Pop Karaoke with old favourites including the Spice Girls and Take That
- *Students who wish to attend these activities will need to pay for the associated direct costs, e.g. Travel or entry fee

GUIDANCE

LUSU staff are able to support you during your time in Lancaster. You should also ensure that you are taking responsibility for your own safety. Here are some top tips and information points for you:

ORIENTATION

- On arrival in the UK a group pick-up will be arranged for students from your institution. You'll be picked up by LUSU (Lancaster University Students' Union) from the airport and transported to the Lancaster University campus.
- You will receive a welcome pack upon arrival that will detail the scheduled activities, maps of the local area, bus timetables and all other essential information
- Should you fall ill there is a pharmacy on campus which you will be able to visit
- Ensure that you keep your luggage tags when you check-in, if any of your luggage is delayed then this will mean we can help you to track it more easily. It would be a good idea to keep a fresh set of clothes in your hand luggage in case this happens.

SAFETY

- Make sure that you have your mobile phone on you at all times and the emergency contact number for staff in the UK
- Do not bring any valuables with you that would not be covered by your insurers
