## **OBJECTIVES**

Participate in an intensive, interdisciplinary program that combines French history and culture, geography and pedology, food production. You will gain valuable insight into French agriculture and cultural landscapes and discover what makes French agriculture unique. Through the optional work placement program, you will gain practical, international experience while earning college credits.



## CREDITS

**Up to 8 US Credits:** 1 US Credit/week and 4 US Credits for the one-month field placement.



## **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

**Juniors, Seniors or Master degree students in** Agricultural Engineering, Agricultural Economy, Agronomy, Landscape Ecology, Human Ecology, or Geography **from an accredited institution.** 

For non-native speakers of English: 785 TOEIC, 567 TOEFL paper (or 227 TOEFLcbt, 87 TOEFLibt), 6.5 IELTS.

French: not required but basic French would be useful for the field experience option.
